

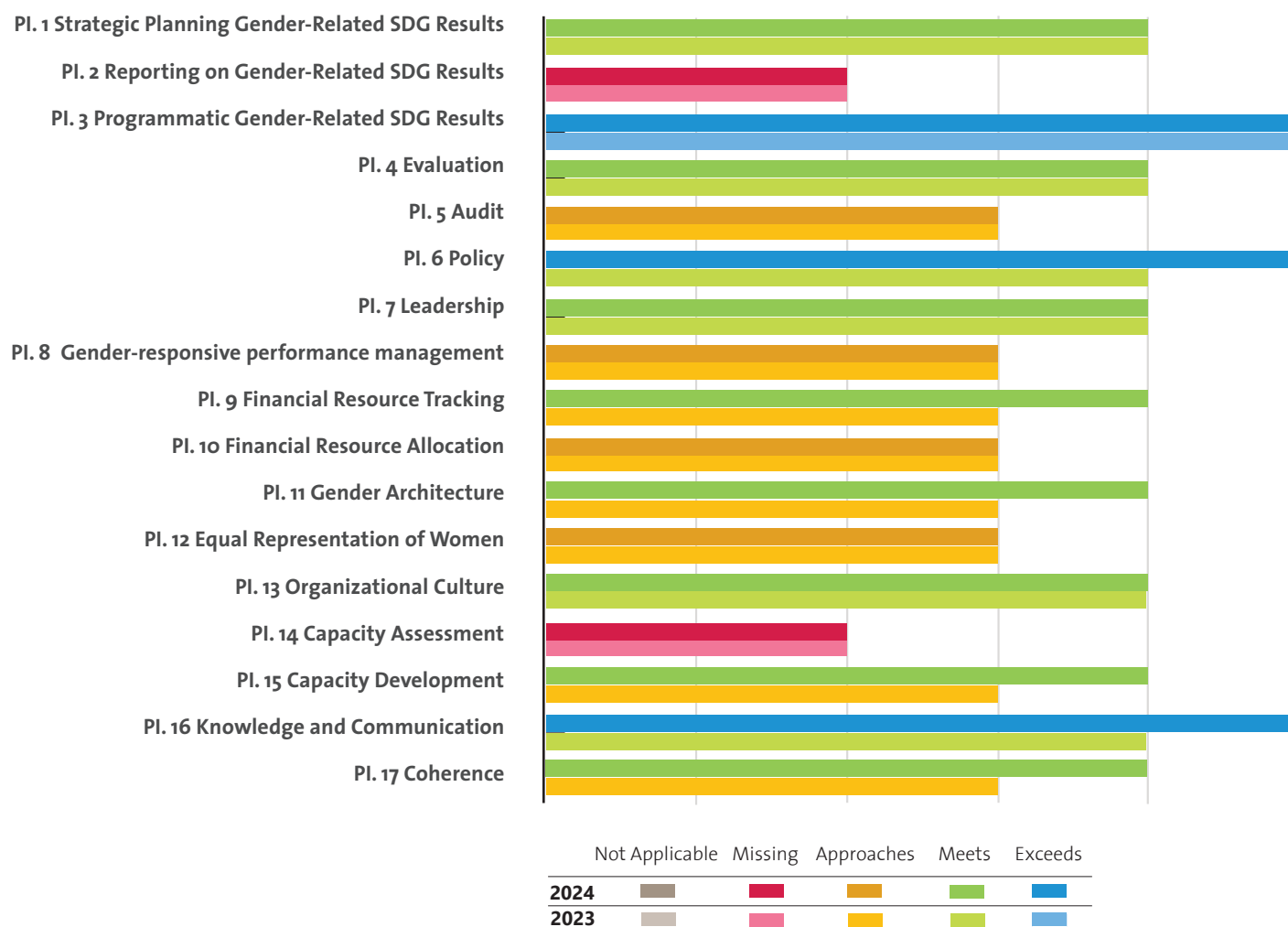

PERFORMANCE HIGHLIGHTS IN 2024

Most significant gains

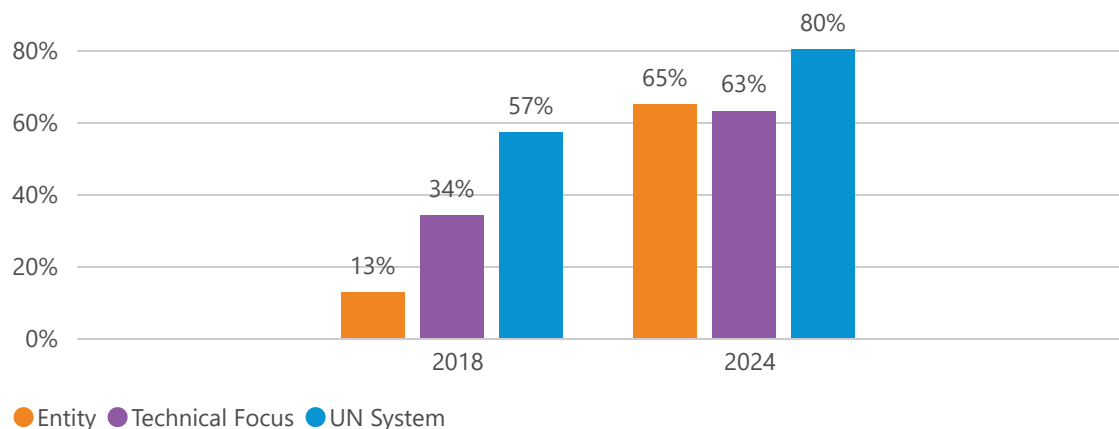
- IMO exceeded the requirements for three indicators and met requirements for another eight indicators.
- Significantly, in 2024, IMO newly exceeded the requirements for the Policy and Knowledge and Communication indicators.

Areas for improvement

- UN Women encourages IMO to focus on the two indicators rated as missing requirements: Reporting on Gender-Related Results and Capacity Assessment and the four indicators currently approaching requirements.

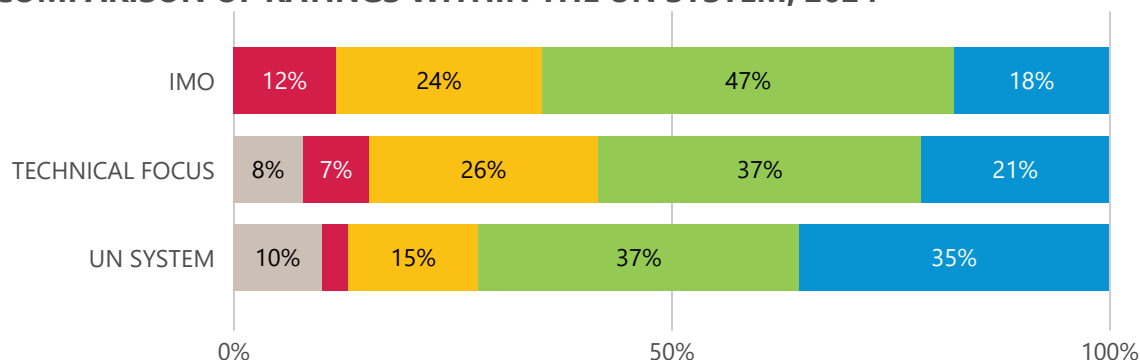
COMPARISON OF OVERALL PERFORMANCE WITHIN THE UN SYSTEM, 2018-2024

PERCENTAGE OF RATINGS MEETING/EXCEEDING REQUIREMENTS (NOT APPLICABLE RATINGS OMITTED)



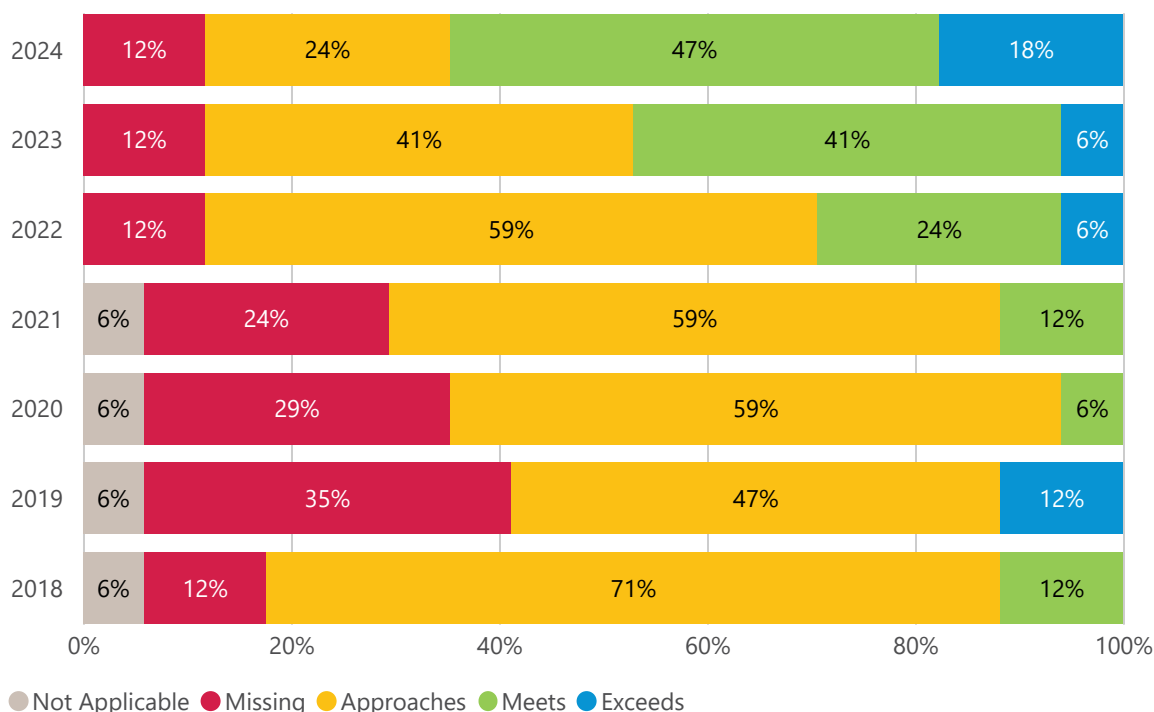
In 2018, IMO trailed the average performance of both the entities with a Technical focus and the overall UN System. In 2024, IMO surpassed the average performance of similar technical entities.

COMPARISON OF RATINGS WITHIN THE UN SYSTEM, 2024



In 2024, IMO exceeded the requirements of fewer indicators compared to the averages of similar entities and the overall UN system. The entity assessed all indicators applicable.

COMPARISON OF RATINGS BY YEAR, ENTITY SPECIFIC, 2018-2024



From 2018 to 2024, IMO made solid progress by "exceeding" and "meeting" five times as many indicators. The entity also significantly reduced the number of indicators rated as "missing" requirements.

In 2024, IMO improved upon its 2023 performance by "exceeding" two additional indicators and "meeting" three additional indicators, marking its strongest UN-SWAP 2.0 performance to date.
